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The minerals known as conflict minerals — Tin, Tantalum, Tungsten and Gold (3TG) — may contribute to the financing of armed groups and may be associated with human rights violations when sourced from conflict-affected and high-risk areas, particularly the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and neighboring countries. Therefore, sourcing these minerals from responsible sources is considered an important sustainability and ethical trade issue in international supply chains.

ELSAN conducts its activities in line with the principles of integrity, ethical business practices, respect for human rights, environmental responsibility and sustainability. In this context, ELSAN is committed to taking the necessary care to avoid the use of minerals sourced from conflict-affected and high-risk areas that may contribute to the financing of conflicts in the materials used in its production processes and supply chain, and to supporting responsible sourcing practices.

ELSAN expects all suppliers within its supply chain to act with the same sense of responsibility. Accordingly, our suppliers are expected to;

- Comply with applicable legal regulations and customer requirements,
- Be transparent about the source of the materials they supply,
- Provide CMRT or equivalent information and documents when requested,
- Share updated information in a timely manner if there are any changes to the information or documents provided.

ELSAN regularly assesses risks related to conflict minerals in its supply chain, carries out continuous improvement activities in cooperation with its suppliers, and ensures that the necessary information and documents are shared transparently and in a timely manner in line with the requirements of its customers and other relevant stakeholders.

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
